

Abstract:

Feminist literary criticism is an interdisciplinary approach which focuses on gender politics. It rarely confines itself to merely textual analysis; rather, it looks at the text within the society in which it was produced in order to discover what this tell us about what gender means in that particular context. Initially, Anglo-American feminist criticism was primarily concerned with challenging the notion of the canon in two main ways. First, critics noted that the texts which constituted the canon were mainly male authored and that their representations of female characters tented to be largely negative and stereotyped. 1980s can be characterized as a decade in which feminist literacy critics looked both backward, to earlier feminist critical work, and outward, to the work of feminist in other disciplines. The combining of existing feminist criticism with feminist theory from other disciplines proved to be a productive dynamic in 1990s. Important influencers on feminist literary criticism in 1990s included Liesbet van Zoonen's (1994) work in media studies
